She has performed and spoke for TEDx Gateway Arch, the Arts and Education Council of St. Louis, moderated conversations with Damon Davis for USDAC and RAC's Culture/Shift 2016 as well as St. Louis Blues Society's Race and Blues series. She's produced live sound design for the Peabody Award-winning podcast "To the Best of Our Knowledge." Conaway, the DJ-in-residence of 2019 at the Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis, has returned to Metro Theater Company after making her acting debut in MTC's production of *Wonderland: Alice's Rock & Roll Adventure*. Currently, she composes original music for classical music organizations, local theater companies, and performs regularly in the region as Syna So Pro.



ALICIA REVÉ LIKE (GRANNY) returns to Metro Theater Company, where she was last seen in *Digging Up Dessa, Ghost, It's a Wonderful Life, The Hundred Dresses*, and *Wonderland: Alice's Rock & Roll Adventure.* Like is a proud graduate of the University of Missouri in Columbia with a B.A. in music. COLIN McLAUGHLIN (ENSEMBLE/MUSICIAN/

COMPOSER) is a St. Louis-based actor, musician, playwright, and teaching artist, who has worked with Bread and Roses Missouri, St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, A Call to Conscience: Interactive Theater for Social Change (C2C), Intersect Arts Center, and COCA. He was last on stage this spring as Charles Kettering in *Big Machine* at COCA. In the fall of 2022, he will portray Andrej in RS Theatrics' production of *Once*. Colin comes from a family of musicians and is an experienced songwriter well-versed in the traditions of jazz, blues, and folk music. He wrote the original jazz score for *Mrs. Palmer's Honey*, an 8-part audio play produced by Bread and Roses Missouri, premiering later this year. Colin is a resident teaching artist with St. Louis Shakespeare Festival at Sumner High School, a project assistant at CHIPs Health and Wellness Center, and a proud member of The Art Collaborative. He received his Bachelor of Science in social work from Saint Louis University in 2018.



CAMILLE SHARP (UNDERSTUDY / ASSISTANT STAGE

MANAGER), a native of St. Louis, is elated to work with Metro Theater Company. This is her first time back working in the theater realm since before the pandemic, and her first time working behind the scenes. Her credits onstage include Margie in *Milk Like Sugar*, ensemble in *Don't Bother Me I Can't Cope*, Sweet Thang in *Nina Simone: Four Women*, and ensemble in *Spell #7* at the St. Louis Black Rep. Camille attended Harris-Stowe State University and has since taken an interest in writing.

JENISE SHEPPARD (CHILD) is a Chicago native who began acting at the age of 7. Now 21 years old, Jenise has taken the stage at Shakespeare's Globe Theater in London, England, ETA Creative Arts Foundation, Beverly Arts Center, Gallery 37, and more. In 2018, Jenise sang back-up for Jason Mraz at the Special Olympics 50th Anniversary Celebration Concert. Since studying drama and interdisciplinary environmental analysis at Washington University in St. Louis, where favorite credits include Lady in Blue in for colored girls and O.G. Howland in Men on Boats, Jenise made their professional debut with Invictus Theatre Company as Sophie in Lynn Nottage's Pulitzer Prize-winning play Ruined. The "Jeff Recommended" production, directed by Ebby Offord, was named one of the city's top ten plays by T.I.C. Top List, and Third Coast Review dubbed "Sheppard [as] one to watch in the Chicago theater world."







DESIGN & PRODUCTION BIOGRAPHIES

ROSEMARY NEWCOTT (DIRECTOR) spent 20 years as the Sally G. Tomlinson Artistic Director of Theatre for Youth and Families at Atlanta's Alliance Theatre. In addition to directing, and sometimes devising two TYA productions a season, Rosemary also mounted David Bell's lavish production of *A Christmas Carol*, featuring an all-Atlanta multicultural cast. Rosemary developed the Alliance Palefsky HS Collision Project and created its thriving Kathy and Ken Bernhardt Theatre for the Very Young program. On the national level, Rosemary has developed/directed two plays at New Visions/New Voices: *Einstein is a Dummy* with Karen Zacarias and Debbie Wicks La Puma and Pearl Cleage's *Tell Me My Dream*. She also directed the premieres of Mo Willem's Knufflebunny: A Cautionary Musical and Laurie Brook's Jason Invisible both at the Kennedy Center and Zacarias' and La Puma's Frida Libre at LaJolla Playhouse. Most recently, Rosemary devised/directed a new musical version of *Thumbelina* with Amanda Morgan and KSU students at Kennesaw University and directed the premiere of Hans Christian Andersen by Tim McDonald at Nashville Children's Theatre. Rosemary also recently directed the debut of Pearl Cleage's *In My Granny's Garden* at the Alliance, and is currently directing the play at Metro Theater Company. Earlier in her career, Rosemary acted/directed in nearly every Atlanta theater company, starting her path at the Academy Theatre.

Rosemary is a recipient of a Princess Grace Foundation Fellowship and also a Princess Grace Special Project Award for her adaptation and direction of André Benjamin's *Class of 3,000 LIVE* at the Alliance. She has received several Atlanta Suzi Awards for direction and the 2010 Spirit of Suzi award. In 2018 she received the Suzi Lifetime Achievement award and in 2019, the Harold Oaks Excellence in TYA award and the AATE Compton Bell Lifetime Achievement award. She is a member of the adjudicator/workshop leader team at Atlanta's Junior Theatre Festival. Throughout her career, she has served as guest artist at Augusta College, Emory University, Georgia State College, Hartwick College, Oglethorpe University, University of West Georgia, and Kennesaw University, as well as numerous high school programs, most notably as a 10-year theater director at the Georgia Governor's Honors Program. Rosemary has proudly served on the board of TYA/USA and is a member of AEA and SDC.

KAT CONLEY (SCENIC DESIGNER) is ecstatic to be joining Metro Theater Company for this delightful show. A scenic designer and artist based in Atlanta, Kat has designed scenery for the Alliance Theatre, Arena Stage, Orlando Shakes, the Kennedy Center, Georgia Shakespeare, Marin Theatre Company, Virginia Stage Company, Actor's Express Theatre Company, Atlanta Ballet, Center for Puppetry Arts, 7 Stages Theatre, Theatrical Outfit, Synchronicity Theatre, Marietta's Theatre in the Square, and Aurora Theatre. PEARL CLEAGE is an Atlanta-based, award-winning playwright and bestselling author, whose works include eight novels and a dozen plays. ZARON W. BURNETT, JR. is an American novelist, director, and performance artist. He is the creator of Club Zebra, Atlanta's only floating speakeasy, cabaret, and international center of bohemian Negritude. Zaron and Pearl regularly join forces as writers and performance artists for a variety of projects. *In My Granny's Garden* is based on a very special summer Zaron, as a five-year-old, spent learning about life with his great-grandmother.



RADCLIFFE BAILEY is a contemporary American artist noted for mixed-media, paint, and sculpture works that explore African American history. His work has been exhibited at many museums including Atlanta's High Museum of Art, and his work is held in many permanent collections, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Smithsonian Museum of American Art, and the Art Institute of Chicago.





METRO THEATER COMPANY LEADERSHIP

JULIA FLOOD (ARTISTIC DIRECTOR) has directed Digging Up Dessa, The Very Hungry Caterpillar Show, It's a Wonderful Life, The Girl Who Swallowed a Cactus, The Hundred Dresses, Frida Libre, Bud, Not Buddy, Hans Brinker and the Silver Skates, The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, And In This Corner: Cassius Clay, Out of the Box, Talkin' Trash, Afflicted: Daughters of Salem, Unsorted, and Say Something, Do Something! for Metro Theater Company since she moved to St. Louis to become artistic director in February 2014. Previously, Julia spent 16 years as



artistic director of Eckerd Theater Company in Clearwater, Florida where she commissioned such plays as *Vote?*, by Eric Coble, provoked by Florida's role in the 2000 presidential election, and *Battledrum* by Doug Cooney with Lee Ahlin, a musical about the effects of war on young people through the lens of Civil War drummer boys, subsequently produced at Metro Theater Company. A graduate of Northwestern University, Julia spent seven years as a resident member of the Bloomsburg Theatre Ensemble in Pennsylvania, a unique artist-led ensemble founded under the guidance of legendary acting teacher Alvina Krause, before following a freelance career as actor/director/playwright/teacher. Julia served on the national board of directors of Theatre for Young Audiences/USA from 2011 to 2019, and brings more than 40 years of experience to her role as artistic director of Metro Theater Company.

JOE GFALLER (MANAGING DIRECTOR) joined the Metro Theater Company team in 2019. During his tenure to date, Metro Theater Company has seen dramatic growth in both its audience base and its donor base. In partnership with Artistic Director Julia Flood, he has co-led the company through its recent evolutions during the COVID-19 pandemic, from its virtual programming to its safe return to live performances. Prior to joining the MTC team, Joe received national recognition for his work in building young, diverse, and national audiences for Opera Theatre of



Saint Louis during his tenure as director of marketing and public relations — and for expanding OTSL's civic footprint as the producer of the company's Opera Tastings series, through artist community tours, and the creation and growth of its Engagement + Inclusion Task Force. His career has also included roles with the American Repertory Theater, the Alliance Theater, and 7 Stages, and consulting projects for the National Blues Museum, the Utah Symphony, and the documentary film *Flint: The Poisoning of an American City.* He has directed over two dozen professional or university productions, including regional premieres by David Mamet, Caryl Churchill, and others. A graduate of Harvard University, he also serves as adjunct faculty at Webster University in the Arts Management and Leadership MFA program.
